Our successful mentoring programs support women to transition from dependence and disadvantage to becoming productive, contributing members of our community. **The National Crime Prevention fund recognised the value of our program and granted us funding for the next two years. A change of Government took that away.** We now need to urgently replace those funds so that we can support the 150 women that our program was aimed at. **Without further funding WIPAN cannot continue to deliver our services and programs.**

You can help **WIPAN** continue its mentoring programs and services that work by making a one off or regular donation.

What your contribution can achieve for women supporting women at WIPAN

- **\$10** per month or **\$120** per year – equips a woman with an essential toiletry pack;
- **\$40** per month or **\$480** per year – trains a **WIPAN** mentor;
- **\$50** per month or **\$600** per year – provides fuel for the **WIPAN** car;
- **\$100** per month or **\$1200** per year – mentors and supports a woman for 16 weeks to transition back into our community;
- **\$330** per month or **\$4000** per year (which is less than \$11 a day) – mentors and supports one woman for an entire year; and
- **\$540** per month or **\$6500** per year - keeps the **WIPAN** car on the road for a year.

Mary's story

Mary always wanted to be a nurse. Since age 11 Mary was sexually abused by her stepdad, who threatened to harm her mother and little brother if she said anything.

Her grades at school went down and she started harming herself. At 14, her mother died of cancer.

Mary couldn't live with her stepdad and ran away from home. Soon after, she discovered she was pregnant with her stepdad's baby.

Mary was sleeping rough with friends she made on the streets. Her 'friends' introduced her to drugs, and sexually assaulted her several times. Her baby was born and taken away.

Mary started stealing to buy drugs and got caught by police, and has been in and out of prison ever since.
